So much upset in the air. Hot weather. Droughts. Storms. Floods. Fires. And that's just the natural stuff. Presidents, our moral as well as political leaders, under investigation or charged for wrong-doing. Inflation. Lay-offs. Rising utility costs. Gas Pump hikes. Eggs at so much per dozen. "The news tells us too much." "The news tells us not enough." "You don't agree with me, so something is wrong with you." Hot-and-heavy electioneering so far from the actual election. Name-calling. Identity crises. And on and on and on and on.


Jesus says, "Therefore I tell you, do not be anxious about your life, what you will eat, nor about your body, what you will put on. For life is more than food, and the body more than clothing. Consider the ravens: they neither sow nor reap, they have neither storehouse nor barn, and yet God feeds them. Of how much more value are you than the birds! And which of you by being anxious [worrying] can add a single hour to his span of life?" (Luke 12:22-25)

When I get anxious about the news cycle, I think back to many years ago when as a teenager, I would visit with my friend his grandparents. Immigrants from Germany, they owned a farm in the Texas Hill Country. And while I don't remember any pithy sayings or nuggets of wisdom, I do remember his quiet confidence and trust in God. Life Line Screening, the nation's leading provider of preventive health screenings, will offer affordable, non-invasive and painless health screenings at Peace Lutheran Church on Tuesday, October 17, 2023.

A package of four screenings to identify risk for stroke, heart disease and other chronic conditions will be offered:

Carotid Artery Screening (Plaque)

An ultrasound is performed to screen the carotid arteries (a pair of blood vessels in the neck that deliver blood to your brain) for buildup of fatty plaque. This buildup, called atherosclerosis, is one of the leading causes of stroke.

Peripheral Arterial Disease Screening An Ankle-Brachial Index (ABI) test is performed using blood pressure cuffs on the arms and legs. It is important to screen for PAD because it increases the risk of coronary artery disease, heart attack, or stroke.¹

Abdominal Aortic Aneurysm (AAA)

An ultrasound is performed to screen the abdominal aorta for the presence of an enlargement or aneurysm. AAA can lead to a ruptured aortic artery, which is a serious medical emergency.

Atrial Fibrillation

A 6-lead electrocardiogram (EKG) is performed by placing sensors on the arms and legs to screen for Atrial Fibrillation. AFib can lead to blood clots, stroke, and heart failure, and other heart-related complications.²

These 4 vital screenings take 60-90 minutes to complete. Register by calling toll free 1-844-591-7160, text the word "circle" to 216-279-1607 or online at https://llsa.social/HC

For which is easier, to say, 'Your sins are forgiven,' or to say, 'Rise and walk'? But that you may know that the Son of Man has authority on earth to forgive sins"—he then said to the paralytic— "Rise, pick up your bed and go home." And he rose and went home. Matt 9:5-7

There are many amongst our church family that, though they may attend church regularly, have a feeling deep in their heart that they are **unforgivable**. I know this because **I** have felt this way. Yet Jesus not only forgives, but he also heals hurt that might be hidden deep away.

Those of you who were able to attend the educations we did this past month know to some extent the breadth of the problem we have in our society today when we talk about human trafficking. It comes in many forms: forced labor, debt bondage, domestic servitude, forced marriage, sex trafficking, child sex trafficking, and the recruitment and use of child soldiers, among others. I know we can't tackle it all, but I also know that as Christians we can't stand back and do nothing. Unfortunately, if you look at a heat map of the U.S., Minneapolis is a hot bed for trafficking. Like the ripple of a pebble tossed into a pond, the ripple of trafficking is far reaching beyond the immediate person in the abuse but affects families, extended families, and communities alike.

One thing we can do is help those in our midst to heal. I have shared before from the RAINN website, https://www.rainn.org/. You may not realize it or know it consciously, but you know an individual or family that has been affected and is in the need of Christ's healing.

Every 68 seconds an American is sexually assaulted.

1 out of every 6 American women has been the victim of an attempted or completed rape in her lifetime.

About 3% of American men—or 1 in 33—have experienced or completed rape in their lifetime.

Statistics suggest that even within our small summer worship (60 total), there are likely 5 women and 2 men who are survivors of sexual abuse. If we expand that to the 100 or so who are somewhat regularly connected to Peace, the numbers grow to 8 women and 3 men. If we consider our entire membership list of 300+ ... well That's a lot of people we know and love who may have been affected by sexual abuse trauma.

I will be starting a Bible study in our home called "Hope and Healing" for survivors and families alike. These are difficult topics and confidentiality is a must as survivors and family sadly often feel shameful, which is why we will hold this study on an evening away from the church to provide as much privacy as we can. Now I do not pretend to be a therapist, so these aren't therapy sessions. I do not pretend to have a magic wand that will instantly wipe away the tears. I do, however, have an understanding from the perspective of being a survivor. Here you will find empathy, and appreciation for the feeling of shame and guilt. But most importantly you will find the forgiveness, love and healing that can only come through the Lord himself, Jesus Christ, your Savior.

The study is comprised of 12 sessions. We will meet twice a month starting Monday September 11 at 6:30 pm. We will continue this study to finish in the Spring just in time for the celebration of new life that is ours on Easter Sunday.
